LETTER FROM SIMON





March letter:

Lent is a journey with Jesus to the cross, and, like him, we don't get to the light and hope of Easter without going there first.

There is nothing sentimental or attractive about the cross. It's not a golden ornament in a church, and hymns about "the precious blood" distract from a story of deliberate and brutal violence.

But that's precisely why the message of the cross is so vital and so powerful. We live in a world of deliberate and brutal violence. Some of the international community have finally found the courage to say that war crimes are being committed in Gaza as families are indiscriminately shelled and bombed. The recent and unexplained death of Alexei Navalny brings into sharp focus the ruthlessness of Vladimir Putin's Russian regime as it seeks to destroy all opposition to its imperial ambitions, starting with conquest of Ukraine.

Less obvious forms of violence are the unaddressed social and economic inequalities which fuel the cost of living crisis, and the disturbing view of a number of right wing politicians that the climate crisis simply does not matter.

A faith that does not address the darkness of this world is an irrelevant faith or an escapist fantasy. Christianity is neither. It has at its heart the astonishing belief, shared by no other religion, that God not only came to meet us by becoming a

human being, but allowed himself to be the victim of the human violence and injustice at its very worst to share it with us.

The Bible explains in a variety of ways how this profoundly changes things, and, allied to the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, enables us to have a genuine hope that good will ultimately triumph over evil. The more of this we can understand, the stronger and more effective our faith will be, but we do not need to wait until we have a greater understanding. The power of the cross is such that for many people all that is needed is to grasp that the person suffering there is actually God, and God is choosing to do this in order to reach us in all of our struggles and failures and sufferings. From that comes a realisation of the intensity of God's love for us, and often a realisation that we must and can respond in faith.

The cross is the gateway to God and that is why in different ways during the week before Easter, we look upon and explore what happened there. If you do not normally come to these Holy Week services, I would encourage you to give God a little extra time and come to maybe just one of them. It could change your life.

What Is Holy Week?

Christianity began because Jesus died for our sins and was raised from the dead. Christians celebrated this weekly as they shared bread and wine, and their most important festival was Easter. Within just a few centuries this also became the time when people wanted to be baptised and the benefits of a period of preparation were soon extended to all Christians by the keeping of the season of Lent. Within this there grew up a custom of having special acts of worship in the week leading up to Easter to focus in depth on the meaning of Jesus' death and resurrection

Here's what we do.

Palm Sunday – We remember Jesus riding into Jerusalem looking like a king, but with a very different purpose in mind. Sometimes we read and explore the whole of one of the Gospel accounts on his arrest, trial and death. We also process into church with palms and give out palm crosses in a special celebration.

Stations of the Cross – When many people could not read it was easiest to tell the story of Jesus in pictures. Each "station" uses a picture to depict an event in Jesus' crucifixion. Our practice is to read the part of Scripture which describes it, along with a second passage which helps us draw out the meaning. We have a short period of silent prayer at each station. This takes place at 8pm on Monday evening in the Church of the Ascension using pictures on the screens. (NB there are no gory or distressing images.)

Maundy Thursday Agapé – "Agapé" is the word for "love" in the original language of the New Testament and it became used to describe the meals at which Christians shared bread and wine to remember Jesus (the origin of Holy Communion). We recall the Last Supper by sharing a meal together with an informal Holy Communion. This takes place 7pm-9pm at St Mary's.

Maundy Thursday Vigil — Jesus went to pray alone in the Garden of Gethsemane, and there is a tradition of spending some time in silent reflection in response. To help focus our thoughts, Jesus' last instructions to his disciples in John 14-17 are read slowly, interspersed with psalms. We do this over quiet music in a one hour service in church and online at 9pm.

Good Friday – Both churches have services at 2pm where we focus on what it means to say that Jesus died for us. The format varies. St Mary's tends to use music and singing, the Ascension uses a variety of formats. The mood is serious, of course, but also uplifting. The cross is the heart of the good news.

Easter Sunday – This, along with Christmas Day, is one of the two occasions when all Anglican Christians are called to come together to share in Holy Communion. It's also the biggest celebration in the year as we sing out the resurrection of Jesus.

Many of us only have a routine of coming to church on a Sunday. Holy Week and Easter is a special time. When we open ourselves up to listen to the story of Jesus we give an opportunity for God to speak with us and meet with us in new ways. Why not try to come to at least one of the extra services in Holy Week. Do it as a special offering of worship to the Christ who died and rose for us all.

Mothering Sunday

This year Mothering Sunday is on March 10th, the second Sunday of the month. We will be having an All Age service at both churches rather than on the first Sunday of the month.

Taizé Prayer Evening – March 7th

This month our Parish Prayer Evening will shaped around the musical prayer style of the famous international Taizé community. In order to help people pray together, Taizé uses simple meditative choruses which can be easily memorised. "Oh Lord, hear my prayer" is one that some of us will know. Along with simple responsive prayers it enables everyone to take part. The Prayer Evening will take place at the Ascension, 8pm-9pm, on Thursday 7th March. Because live music does not work well on Zoom, we will not be able to share this event online so do come along.

Lent Night Prayer online – Tuesdays at 9.30pm

Night Prayer or Compline is a traditional way to end the day in prayer. It's a short service of prayer with responses and readings, intentionally quiet and reflective, and intended to help us reflect back with God on the day which is ending. Short prayer stops like this help us to deepen our connection with God, so do try it out if you have never done something like this. Please email Simon if you do not already have the Zoom link.

This little girl would like to be a doctor when she grows up. Her mother is a tea plucker. But, like many mothers who pluck the leaves that make your cuppa (most tea pluckers are women), she lives in poverty in a tiny, crowded, dilapidated house, without clean drinking water or electricity.

This is just one example of how THIRST is trying to help and the Ascension Friends were pleased to make a donation to the charity.

Founded in 1799, CMS is an evangelistic mission working to see a world transformed by the love of Jesus. Today they are a community of people in mission working in over 50 countries, directly supporting more than 700 people and drawing thousands more into local mission wherever they are. CMS workers are transforming lives from south London to Nepal and from Ukraine to Argentina, as they hand out Bibles in conflict zones, treat drug addicts, run HIV clinics and witness the love of Christ to those around them, in practical and spiritual ways. CMS also helps local churches to explore what mission means where they are.

Their values are to be:

Pioneering - constantly seeking and moving to the edges of church, society and ourselves, and calling others to do the same: to try new things, ask questions, cross boundaries and not get too comfortable.

Evangelistic - sharing Jesus in word and action with people at the edges and inviting them to be part of his story.

Relational - getting alongside people, becoming a genuine part of the edge-based communities where we find ourselves, recognising that often we are guests not hosts.

Faithful - remaining true to our calling and not getting discouraged easily. We recognise that mission at the edges takes time, that God is our leading partner in all we do and can be trusted to bring needed change.
