LETTER FROM SIMON







May letter:

Thursday 9th May is Ascension Day. It's often one of the forgotten festivals of the Christian year, but fortunately one of our churches takes its name from it and so we make sure we always celebrate it.

Although the event itself is only described at the end of Luke's Gospel and at the start of Acts, it is assumed everywhere else in the New Testament. Whatever precisely happened on Mount Olivet outside Jerusalem, the first Christians knew exactly what it meant. This was nothing less than Jesus's coronation. For forty days after his resurrection he repeatedly came and spent time with his disciples, but at the end of that time he left the physical world to take his rightful place on the throne of God in the unseen reality we call heaven. The Bible repeatedly talks about Jesus in the same words it uses for God and in the book of Revelation Jesus is described as "the ruler of the kings of the earth" (Rev 1:5).

What does this really mean? In some ways it was clearer in those first centuries. The Roman emperor had god-like status and demanded absolute loyalty. To say that Jesus was Lord was to say that Caesar was not. The Christians believed they were to be law-abiding citizens, but they refused to take part in the pagan sacrifices and for many

years refused to serve in the Roman army. Their ultimate loyalty was to God's kingdom above any human kingdom.

Today in Britain it has less immediate impact to say that Jesus is Lord. Our leaders do not demand absolute loyalty - in fact they often struggle even to gain respect. We still have a memory of being a country shaped by Christianity in its laws and values. Increasingly however, this is no longer the case. We have seen too many politicians, even in the highest offices, whose beliefs and behaviour are far from Christian. The same might be said for many of the policies we see put forward which are devoid of care for God's creation and lacking in compassion for the poor and vulnerable for whom the Bible says God has special concern. As Christians we will continue to be law-abiding members of society who work for the common good. At the same time there will be occasions when our belief that Jesus is Lord means that we can no longer fit comfortably into the status quo.

In what sense, also, does Jesus rule the kings [or rulers] of the earth"? That rule seems pretty ineffective in today's Middle East. The Bible makes clear that although Jesus is the world's true ruler, the world continues to resist his rule until the day when he comes again in his true majesty. That is why, in the prayer Jesus taught us, we pray "your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven." We pray this because it is not happening yet, and part of

the reason why we pray is because by doing so we bring it closer to reality.

This month, instead of our usual monthly prayer evening, we will be taking part in a global Anglican prayer movement called "Your Kingdom Come" which now takes place annually between Ascension Day (May 9th) and Pentecost (May 19th). This year we are encouraged to go on prayer walks around our neighbourhoods, observing what is going on around us and quietly praying "your kingdom come" for the people and places that we see. We are planning to do this in twos and threes in the early evening on Friday 10th May. Please do give an hour to take part – with the added encouragement that we will probably go and eat somewhere afterwards.

The Ascension is not just a day in the year or the name of one of our Parish churches. It is an event in the life of Jesus which shapes how we think about God and about the world in which we live, and as a result how we live. If you are a Christian, you say that Jesus is Lord. What does that mean for you?

As usual our main celebration will be a joint Sunday Morning Service at the Ascension on Sunday May 12th. This is what is known as our Patronal Festival. Many churches are named after a saint who is their "patron saint." The Ascension takes its name from the festival of Jesus returning to heaven after his resurrection, but we still call it a "patronal" festival in reference to where the church name comes from. There will not be a service at St Mary's on that Sunday.





Prayer Walking The Parish

In unity with other Christians across London, the UK, and the world, we are invited to spend time between Ascension Day and Pentecost, the period which the disciples spent in prayer, walking our neighbourhoods to pray for our local communities.

In groups of twos or threes we will walk these routes, quietly praying for the people and places along the way. Afterwards we will gather for a short time back at the Ascension to share our reflections from our prayer time. After that we hope there will be a plan to all go and eat somewhere.

Remembering Betty Barker



Betty Barker (1927 to 2024), whose funeral was held at the Church of the Ascension on 11th April, grew up around Leeds before moving to London in 1949 to take up a job as a nanny in Sussex Square.

In 1952 Betty made a career move and joined the Civil Service as a typist. She met her husband, Ron Barker, when working in an office in

Waterloo and they were married in 1959. Betty was a dedicated mother to her two sons, Geoffrey and John and also cared for her parents-in-law, with whom she shared a home in Boileau Road.

Betty attended the Church of the Ascension and Geoffrey and John were baptised there — and later introduced to the Sunday School. By the 1970s, the whole Barker family was active in the life of the church. Ron, Geoffrey and John were confirmed on the same day, 26th November 1975. Ron acted as Stewardship Recorder, helping to keep the church finances in order; Geoffrey and John were altar servers and enjoyed the Saturday night youth club.

Betty returned to work in the 1970s and from 1980 to 1992 she worked as a typist in Ealing Tax Office.

Betty and Ron enjoyed hosting a sherry and mince pies reception in their home each year for members of the church who had been out carol singing around the parish. This was always a popular and enjoyable occasion. Betty was a popular member of the community and helpful neighbour, often doing the shopping for neighbours in Boileau Road and taking older members of the church family in her car on her weekly visits to Sainsbury's.

Betty loved her family, including her nephews and niece and the children they produced when they got married. She loved family gatherings at Christmas and on other occasions and was always up to speed with family news. She was a kind neighbour and good friend to many people throughout her long life. She was always cheerful, never judgemental and was always more ready to listen than be listened to.

She spent the last 14 months of her life in The Meadows Care Home, Greenford, and was very content there. She still kept in touch with her many friends, many of whom visited her in The Meadows. She maintained her mental ability and could still send emails, do online banking and use her iPad until the end of her life.

Betty had a strong and practical Christian faith and received monthly Bible reading notes until the end of her life.

Geoffrey, Betty's son, delivered the eulogy at the Service of Thanksgiving and asserted his confidence that his mother is now safe in eternal life.

Bishop Lusa Cycles To The Ascension For Earth Day

As reported earlier in this month's Parish News, to mark Earth Day last month the Bishop of Willesden cycled between the 14 churches in the Diocese that have achieved a Silver Award in A Rocha's environmental programme. It was 26-mile circuit starting at St Anselm Belmont in Harrow ending at the Ascension where the small group of cyclists were greeted by welcome cups of tea and biscuits.

Bishop Lusa explained how this year's Earth Day theme is to highlight the urgent need to curb plastic pollution, a global problem which is affecting every citizen on Earth. Started in 1970 in the USA it is now a global environmental movement across 141 countries and has a different theme each year. The aim this time is for countries to start working towards a 60% reduction in the production of plastics by 2040 and ultimately a plastic pollution treaty backed by the United Nations to see single-use plastics being phased out altogether.

On the cycling circuit the Bishop was accompanied by Christopher Ramsay, Willesden's Director of Mission and was joined for the last two legs to our parish by Colin McKenzie at St Stephen's and then Gillian Harrison at St Barnabas. At the Ascension, Philippa Bird and Simon, waiting with tea-makers Josette Lubbock and Sue Lawes, had the opportunity to tell the Bishop about what we are trying to do locally on environmental matters and were encouraged by him in our efforts. He reminded us of the wise words often attributed either to Mahatma Ghandi or Mother Teresa: "We need to live simply so others can simply live."

The Lord is always there for us


To lead us to the track he wants us to go


